Indigenous Entrepreneur Award

Christine Marie, a mom of two, launched Awasis Boutique in Feb 2018 as an online shop. Awasis means child in Cree. It is the first Indigenous inspired baby and kids fashion shop in Western Canada. What started off as products for baby and kids has now grown into offering a variety of fashion pieces for the entire family. Made with authentic, Indigenous themed fabric prints, designed by Christine, as well as her most popular products, onesies and tees, featuring phrases in the Cree and Michif langauges. In her first year of business, she created partnerships with 10 retailers. She was named a finalist for CBCS Top 40 under 40 in 2019. She successfully completed 3 separate business courses in her 2nd year of business, including the Matchstick Program with WESK. Christine's creativity, determination and passion to run a successful business and develop healthy, business relationships with Indigenous and non-Indigenous people make her a positive role model for Indigenous women and girls.

Ryde YXE Cycle Studio was co-founded by long time friends, Shaina Lynden and Bradie Mustoe in February of 2016 as the first dedicated indoor cycling studio in Saskatoon. With two thriving locations, COVID-19 greatly impacted operations and Shaina and Bradie found themselves facing complete closures. Continuing to remain optimistic and innovative, they made the difficult decision to permanently close their Broadway location due to ongoing restrictions and needs for public safety and worked tirelessly to invest in a warehouse space for greater social distancing so that more people could safely attend. Additionally, as restrictions continued to change and concerns for public health grew, they created an online, Ryde from home platform, rented out bikes and completely shifted once again in the wake of a second closure. After having faced nearly 7 months of complete closures and an ongoing mandated operating capacity of less than 20%, Shaina and Bradie continue to persevere through a belief in their product and community and remain leaders within the boutique fitness industry in Saskatchewan, selling out classes weekly and continuing to rise.
