

Over the course of these 7. 5 years WESK has evolved into a reputable and credible organization. We have encountered many challenges, surmounted obstacles, and celebrated many triumphs. I have watched this organization make a significant impact on the lives of women entrepreneurs in our province. You have inspired me and proven to be some of the most resilient entrepreneurs in Canada. I am honored to have developed these relationships and friendships.

I am grateful for the trust and confidence bestowed on me by my Board of Directors, which empowered me to seize opportunities and grow the organization. I am incredibly proud of the passion and tenacity of the WESK team. With an unparalleled commitment and talent, rest assured they will continue to support and serve you with no disruption.

This past year was one of adaption, characterized by enormous growth. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic,47% of women-owned businesses in Saskatchewan stayed fully open, compared to the national average of 37%. They also had a greater likelihood of reopening after a temporary shutdown. I am pleased to share these statistics, along with many others, from the Women Entrepreneurs in Saskatchewan Report released by the Government of Saskatchewan in November of 2021. Alongside this report, the Government of

Saskatchewan announced The Scale Up for Entrepreneurs initiative. From this, WESK was formally awarded project funding for the Propel program. Propel is a one-year program designed specifically to support Saskatchewan women entrepreneurs by providing opportunities to obtain certifications and training to help grow and scale their businesses.

The Women-Owned Business Brand Identity was successfully launched in 2021 along with the Saskatchewan Women Entrepreneurship Charter and these initiatives have expanded to over 500 women-owned businesses and over 50 Charter Champions. We also signed four impactful memorandums of understanding with influential local organizations. There was an incredible response to our programs, Founders Table, Exchange, Matchstick, and the launch of Propel. Saskatchewan has truly set an example for the rest of Canada on how to uplift and support women entrepreneurs.

Serving as the CEO of WESK has been one of the most remarkable experiences of my life. To my colleagues, members, and friends, thank you for making the past 7.5 years so special. It has been an incredible journey, and the best is yet to come. I hope you will continue to support WESK in positioning Saskatchewan as a preeminent place for women to start, grow and scale their businesses.

Diversity is one of our core values as an organization, and we aim to be as inclusive as possible. We are proud of our diverse membership, which includes members located all over our province from various industries and stages of business. In the coming fiscal year, we will continue building an inclusive community founded on education, advocacy, and support!

CHANGES IN 2021-22

In April 2021, WESK revamped our membership model, moving from one option to three. This reflects the needs of our members and allows them to grow into the WESK community as their business continues to expand. We initiated this program to promote a more inclusive space for entrepreneurs at every level. New members can become involved with WESK as a Pioneer, Trailblazer, or Changemaker.

The Pioneer (\$25 + GST)

The Pioneer package is ideal if you have an idea or are thinking about entrepreneurship. If you want to be in WESK's sphere of influence but don't know where to start, The Pioneer package is perfect.

The Trailblazer (\$125 + GST)

The Trailblazer package is ideal if you are starting a business and want continual support from WESK throughout your journey. We will connect you to resources for Saskatchewan entrepreneurs, and the people you need to get established.

The Changemaker (\$375 + GST)

The Changemaker package is ideal if you are already established and are looking to grow your business with us and take it to the next level. WESK will help you scale your company and make meaningful connections to other entrepreneurs and corporate execs. At this level, you get it all. Think of it like VIP access to the business community.

From Tattoos to Worldviews:

HALEY'S STORY

Haley is making a mark on Saskatoon's tattoo scene with a tattoo gun and her drive to change how we perceive tattoos in professional spaces. Haley is the owner of Honey Bee Tattoo Collective, but her work extends beyond the beautiful and open space. She continues to work to end the stigma surrounding professional working women with tattoos - a task that's nearly as painful as the tattooing process itself. Changing public opinion about tattoos has been an uphill fight since the beginning. However, Haley aims to make a difference through meaningful conversations about women entrepreneurs' vulnerability and relatability.

Haley sat down with WESK to talk about her vision and what she's doing to shift the conversation about tattoos:

WHAT MOTIVATES YOU TO BE AN ENTRE-PRENEUR?

I've always had big dreams, and never felt like that was something I could accomplish in a typical work setting. Even after starting my career as a tattoo artist, I didn't fit into the traditional industry standard, and felt like I could be doing so much more with my platform. I see so much potential within our growing community, and a clear gap in this currently booming industry. I opened Honey Bee to create a space for myself, and others like me, to work and grow uninhibited.

WHAT SUPPORTS HAVE MEANT THE MOST TO YOU ALONG THE WAY?

The unwavering support from my family and friends has undoubtedly been the most meaningful to me, I could not have gotten even remotely this far without them. However, the response and the support from the community, my peers and

my clients, has absolutely been the driving factor for me and truly means everything to me. I never expected the immediate acceptance into the community and to see the impact I've made already means that everything was worth it.

HOW HAS WESK MADE AN IMPACT IN YOUR JOURNEY AS AN ENTREPRENEUR?

WESK made this entire journey possible for me, not only financially but with invaluable guidance and continuous support. They have opened the doors to a great community, and continuously provided me with valuable networking opportunities and experiences.

WHAT MESSAGE OF ENCOURAGEMENT DO YOU HAVE FOR OTHER WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS?

As intimidating as the current state of the world might seem, it's an incredible time for opportunities if you can see them, especially for women or those from other minorities. If you have good intentions, that will be recognized and received; the support from your community and your peers will surprise you. It will never be easy but it will be so worth it.






Since 1995

Since WESK began in 1995, almost 10, 000 women have accessed our business advising services! This milestone identifies our core mandate as a clear necessity in Saskatchewan. With over \$40 million dollars accessed through our financing program in our tenure, we are proud to be a necessary fixture in women's lives and Saskatchewan at large; by creating over 1800 jobs in the province through our funding program alone! With the generous help of the Prairies Economic Devel-

opment Canada (PrairiesCan), formerly Western Economic Diversification, we have increased our funding capacity for women entrepreneurs. In 1995, Prairies Economic Development Canada (PrairiesCan), formerly Western Economic Diversification, provided WESK with a total of \$5 million, which WESK has grown to \$8.2 million, allowing us to provide financing for even more entrepreneurs.



Programs

THE EXCHANGE

This program was developed for established entrepreneurs looking to take their business to the next level. Our first year of the program wrapped up in May 2021 with an amazing virtual retreat. The retreat featured keynote speakers Tina Beaudry-Mellor from Economic Development Regina and Catherine Metrycki from Callia Flowers.

The second year of the program kicked off with a bang! While year 1 was focused on pivoting due to the pandemic, this year focused on learning and ensuring all participants have the information and resources they need to grow/scale. Our kick-off retreat was held on September 16th, 2021 and featured Danielle Graham of Archangel/Fierce Founders as the keynote. We were also lucky to have Tracey Kowalchuk facilitate a DISC workshop for all attendees. After great feedback from year 1, our format shifted from live expert presentations to pre-recorded expert videos with live Q&A sessions each month. We



also held retreats from December 14-16th (in-person and virtually) with Jolene Watson, who facilitated a networking workshop that was really productive for our participants!

Year 2 Stats

- 7 cohorts with revenues ranging from under \$100,000 to over \$1 million
- · Approximately 75 participants

We are looking forward to year 3, which will focus on "Growth in Action" and implementing the learning from the past 2 years.

We are looking forward to seeing eachother for in-person retreats this coming year.



This program offers a collection of supports to help women throughout all stages of their tech entrepreneurial journey. In Canada, female founders in technology are under-represented and comprise only 6% of the tech sector. The long-term vision of Founders Table is to move the needle on the representation of women founders in this sector. Since 2019, Founders Table has been explicitly offered to female tech founders or women in tech. The Mastermind groups are now well underway, and it's going great! The groups have gelled, and already they are helping each out with advice and connections.

In addition to providing places for women to meet, we partnered with StartUp TNT to host a Women in VC event on March 24th at the Saskatoon Club. In addition, we offered a Compass pathfinding event to help women in tech navigate the different players in the industry with Co.Labs, Cultivator, and SaskTech.

Participants had the opportunity to meet, learn, and discuss topics like building their dream team, connecting design principles with product development, deep diving into digital marketing, and learning how to pitch funders with the utmost confidence.



CONNECTING WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY

Founders Table is now a collection of programs and supports to help women at any stage of their tech entrepreneurial journey, including:

- Tech Advising

MATCHSTICK

Launched in 2018, this program is designed for Indigenous, Métis, and Inuit women interested in entrepreneurship and who want to bring their ideas to life. Created in consultation with Indigenous and Metis entrepreneurs in the province, we are proud to provide this program.

From January - March of 2022, WESK piloted a new Matchstick workshop called "Sparking Entrepreneurship in You", facilitated by Destinee Peter, owner of Tangles Hair & Beauty Salon in Regina. This pilot program is virtual and has 16 women registered from across Saskatchewan. In this program, participants will understand if entrepreneurship is a good fit, explore and build their business idea, and learn business fundamentals.

Propel is a one-year training program developed as part of the Government of Saskatchewan's Scale-Up for Entrepreneurs Initiative. This program is designed specifically to support Saskatchewan women entrepreneurs growing and scaling their businesses. Program design and development are underway, and recruitment is complete. We are excited for the Propel Program to launch early in the 2022-23 fiscal year.

Propel provides opportunities for women entrepreneurs to:

- · Obtain micro-credential training certifications
- · Complete self-led learning modules
- Apply learnings directly to their business
- · Have access to coaching and mentorship



theHiveYQR

In partnership with Economic Development Regina (EDR), and FHQ Developments, WESK launched the Hive YQR in January 2022, as a pilot program for Regina entrepreneurs. The program is structured as an informal peer mentorship program, where any level of entrepreneur may receive advice, and where any business expert can share advice. By leveraging this energy and community, the Hive YQR facilitates connections to help all entrepreneurs succeed.



Ministry of Corrections

In September 2021, WESK completed a 'train the trainer' session with representatives from the Ministry of Corrections. The Sparking Entrepreneurship in You program started as a partnership between the Ministry of Corrections and WESK. We created the program content, and the Ministry of Corrections will present the program to incarcerated women in Saskatchewan. In this program, women will build confidence in their future, learn about business basics, and create a business vision board.







Branding with Purpose

In April of 2021, WESK launched a movement to help Saskatchewan entrepreneurs identify themselves as a local woman-owned/led business. Businesses who partake receive access to the "Saskatchewan Woman-Owned Saskatchewan Business" logo, are added to our women-owned database and have the opportunity to be featured across WESK's social channels.





As of March 31, 496 women-owned businesses have joined the movement!
















- · 72% of Charter Champions are actively looking to incrementally increase their procurement from women-owned suppliers for the upcoming year.

Our core services remained fully accessible during the 2020-21 fiscal year, allowing women the opportunity to seek financial support and one-to-one business support at a time when they needed it most.

BUSINESS ADVISING

Unlimited, 1-to-1 business advice, free with a WESK membership.

FINANCING

Up to \$150,000 is available to Saskatchewan businesses that are majority woman-owned.

TRAINING

Learning never stops for an entrepreneur. WESK's signature workshop, Business Plan Basics, provides an in-depth step-by-step for developing a business plan. This 1-hour virtual workshop teaches first-time entrepreneurs the strategies for moving their business idea out of their heads and into a concrete plan.

This year, WESK connected over 2,500 entrepreneurs to training through more than 100 workshops. Each week, we offered different webinars on a variety of business topics.

We are proud of the diversity of topics and focus areas we covered this year, and we look forward to continuing these webinar series into the coming year.

Confidence matters in business, and WESK is here to help women step into bold leadership as entrepreneurs. No matter what stage of the journey an entrepreneur finds herself in, our business advisors are here to lend an ear, provide guidance, and point to the right resources.

Members are quick to tell us about the impact of having someone take the time to understand their business goals and challenges, support them in creating a business plan, or help them take the next step toward their vision. These supports are invaluable, especially in light of the gender-based barriers for women.

ALL-ACCESS EXPERT ADVICE

The All-Access Expert Advice Program is an exclusive opportunity to connect with professionals in Saskatchewan. The WESK roster includes leading experts in marketing, legal, accounting, and human resources industries!

This high-impact, low-barrier service provides tailored support for women, whether starting, growing, or scaling a business. The All-Access Expert Advice Program has been running since 2018, and we owe it all to our partners and specialized experts. Your generous support of this program helps fill in the gaps for women running small businesses across the province.

FINANCING

A key finding of the Saskatchewan Advisory Committee on the Gender Entrepreneurship Gap was that women are less likely to secure capital than men. WESK understands how hard business capital can be to access - particularly for women - and our WESK Financing Fund aims to address this gap with loans of up to \$150,000.

We are thrilled to continue the legacy of financial support for women entrepreneurs. This year, we funded several new loans through the WESK Financing Fund and helped protect many Saskatchewan jobs through the Regional Relief and Recovery Fund (RRRF). If your business is majority woman-owned and controlled (51%), come to talk to our friendly business advisors to see how a loan could help you grow your business. Interest paid from your loan goes back into our financing fund, which helps us provide even more loans to women entrepreneurs.

Equity Investment Fund

Managed by WESK, this fund has disbursed a total of 16 Equity Investment Loans – totalling \$112,641 – since its inception in 2012

Regional Relief and Recovery Fund

The Government of Canada announced the Regional Relief and Recovery Fund to provide financial support directly to small and medium-sized women-owned businesses. Loans of up to \$60,000 were available through WESK to address COVID-19 impacts on short-term stability. This access to financing will support small enterprises that are unable to access more extensive federal relief funding programs or unable to obtain a loan/credit from traditional financial institutions struggling with working capital needs.

Advocating For Women Entrepreneurs in Saskatchewan

We continue to work hard to ensure that while providing support and community for women entrepreneurs, we are also lobbying to create permanent change in our communities and at the municipal and provincial levels. This fiscal year, WESK supported businesses struggling through the Covid-19 pandemic, advocated to close the wage gap, and provided a framework for access to spaces by advocating for equitable business practices.

Enabling Scale in Saskatchewan

On November 30, 2021, the Government of Saskatchewan released a new *Women Entrepreneurs in Saskatchewan* report, which provides statistical information about female self-employment and women-owned businesses by sector from 2007 to 2020.

The report further advances the recommendations in the Enabling Scale in Saskatchewan report developed by WESK's Advisory Committee on Gender Entrepreneurship Gap.

The report also compares women-owned businesses and male-owned businesses in Saskatchewan and Canada for business indicators like employment, revenue and assets.

- Be a vehicle to share relevant information with colleagues to further the Council's priority items and individual advocacy efforts.

Over the past year, we have been proud to represent women's voices in an otherwise difficult time for Saskatchewan business owners. Among the hardest hit over the course of the pandemic, advocating for local businesses was necessary. This year, we contributed invaluable insight to SBC's communications both internally and with the Government of Saskatchewan. We are proud to continue to advocate for women throughout the many changes for Saskatchewan business owners and CEOs.
